Attendance



As you know, we launched our new attendance policy in September. We are committed to improving the children's life chances and aspirations and can only do that if they attend school every day. Consistent attendance maximizes learning opportunities, builds strong bonds with peers and teachers, and equips them with essential life skills. Your support in ensuring your child's punctuality and attendance, is invaluable as it sets the foundation for their academic success.

Together, let's make every school day count!



142 children have had their 100% Attendance Badge Awarded for Autumn Term 1. Every child will have the chance to earn their Autumn 2 badge and we are looking for our Attendance Ambassadors who will be presented with trophies for 100% Attendance at the end of the year. Last year, 8 children received this honour.

Our whole school attendance is currently 92.7%, just below the National average of 93.1%

We reward classes for excellent attendance each week and they get to move around our 'CLASSOPOLY BOARD' – 1 move for 96%; 2 moves for 98% and 3 moves for 100% attendance. Treasure Chests bring surprises for the class and they can also land on spaces to get extra playtimes etc.. Currently 2H are in the lead! It's all to play for!

After Half Term, children will be collecting points in their class teams every time the class hits 100% attendance for that day. When they reach 15, they will get 5 bonus moves on the board.

Congratulations to 6T, who have the highest attendance this half term with 96.8%, closely followed by 1M with 95.7%, 2H with 95.6% and 3M with 95.5%.

Thank you for your support in ensuring the children attend school regularly and on time every day.

Reading

We expect every child to read, or be read to, every night for between 10 to 20 minutes.

Extending our school day by 15 minutes has meant we have been able to prioritise reading and we're so proud of the progress the children are making!












Writing

We've changed our approach to writing significantly this year and badges will be introduced after half term to celebrate excellence. Children have really enjoyed writing for a purpose and have produced some superb leaflets, letters, diary entries and stories.



Maths

In Celebration Assembly, children are also rewarded for progress on Times Tables Clubs- please keep practising with your children.

In Years 3 to 6, we are having a huge drive on Arithmetic fluency and precision and, after half term, badges will be given for progress in this.

We are committed to giving our children leadership opportunities, allowing them to be heard and to give them a voice. As such, we have introduced several initiatives this year including:

Subject Ambassadors



We recognise that children have talents in subjects other than English and Maths and have introduced Subject Ambassadors this year. These children have shown enthusiasm and aptitude for a particular subject and can talk about their learning confidently to visitors and staff. Ambassadors have been chosen from each class in Years 1 to 6 in: English, Maths, Geography, Art, RE, PSHE, PE, Music, Spanish, Science and ICT. History and DT will come after half term. If your child has been chosen, you should be extremely proud. We hope this will inspire and give our children ambition to become historians, artists, architects, sportspeople and musicians of the future.

Values Ambassadors



Over 100 children have been awarded a values Ambassador badge for RESPECT this half term. We're still waiting for the badges to be delivered, but as soon as they come, they will be able to wear these with pride.



The badges that children are awarded this year should be worn daily. Once they reach 10, they will be given a medallion and can pin the badges onto the lanyard. I hope to invite parents to this very special assembly if possible. There are more badges being planned throughout the school year.

Pupil Parliament



The children all had an opportunity to vote for our Primary Minister this half term. Four of our Year 6 children put themselves up for the role and wrote speeches, put up posters, spoke to children in classes and canvassed in the playground for votes, just like Politicians would.



Congratulations to **Grace** who won the vote. The other candidates now become part of the Pupil Parliament Leadership Team with Deputy Minister being **Madison** and Assistant Ministers, **Hibba and Josh**. Three classes also voted in new ministers.

House Captains



New House Captains have also been chosen by our Head of Houses after children were asked to express interest in the role. They have a very important job to lead their team and collect weekly house point totals from classes. This year we've added the role of House point Secretary which Olivia carries out diligently every week.

Currently Sapphire are leading with 4451 points, Emerald is second with 4058 points, Citrine is third with 3706 points and Ruby is fourth with 3415 points.

Junior PCSOs



A number of children in Year 5 applied to become Junior PCSOs this year. 10 were successful and will now begin their sessions with PCSOs Ange Perry and Clare Tugby.

They will take part in a range of activities including First aid Training, Community work, Fire safety, Road Safety and learn about the role of the Police officer.

Play Champions



14 children are now Play Champions after applying for the role. Their duties are to assist Miss Gray in creating new play guidance, support assemblies, capture our great play, support children and be great play role models.
