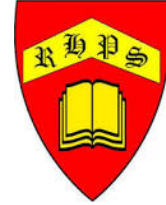

This half term really does seem to have flown by, but we've been very busy yet again.

Attendance

202 children have had their **100% Attendance Badge** Awarded for Spring Term 2. Every child will have the chance to earn their Summer 1 badge after Easter, and we hope with the better weather and a few more days of sunshine, that we all feel a bit healthier! We continue to look for our **Attendance Ambassadors** who will be presented with trophies for 100% Attendance at the end of the year. There are currently **37 children** on track to achieve this, compared to 8 children who received this honour last year.



Our whole school attendance is currently 93.55%, just ABOVE the National average of 93%.

Congratulations to 2A, who have the highest attendance this half term with 96.88%, closely followed by RM with 96.80%, and 2H with 96.75%

Your support in ensuring your child's punctuality and attendance, is invaluable as it sets the foundation for their academic success.

Reading

We expect every child to read, or be read to, every night for between 10 to 20 minutes. Books need to be returned in your child's book bag **every day**. Please look after the books that are sent home - we have had to start charging some to replace books that have come back torn, written in or have had liquid or food spilt on them which has made them unreadable.

Online Safety

Every child is different and will deal with the effects of online abuse in a variety of ways, but there are certain signs that could signal that something is wrong. Signs might include:

- A change in behaviour, including being nervous, losing confidence, or becoming distressed and withdrawn.
- A change in eating or sleeping habits.
- A change in how they are performing in school, such as a dip in grades.
- Spending a lot more or a lot less time than usual online, texting, gaming, or using social media.
- Seeming distant, upset, or angry after using the internet or texting.
- Being secretive about who they are talking to and what they are doing online or on their mobile phone.



If you notice these signs or a marked change in behaviour in your child, a great first step is trying to open channels of communication for them to share their concerns.

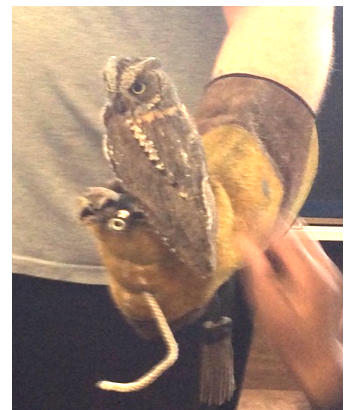
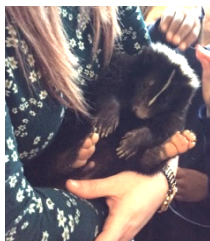

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

If your child is in Reception, Years one or two, you will automatically be entitled for free meals under the 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' criteria. However, if you do meet the criteria opposite and/ or have a child in Years 3,4,5 and 6 then you will need to submit an online claim in order for school to receive Pupil Premium funding.

Free School Meals

If you receive any of the following support payments your child may be entitled to Free School Meals

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit Run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

If you currently receive free school meals but have now moved into the area, you will need to complete a new Free School Meals Application form

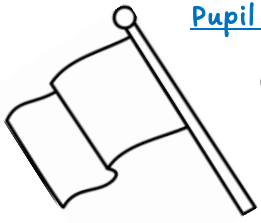


Parents Evenings



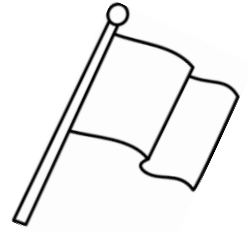

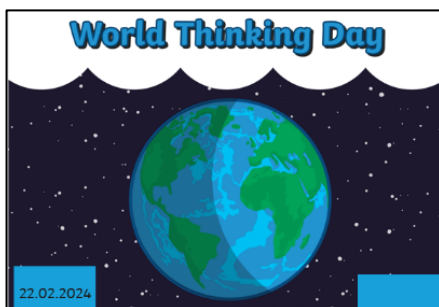
We are looking to hold our first introductory meeting on:
