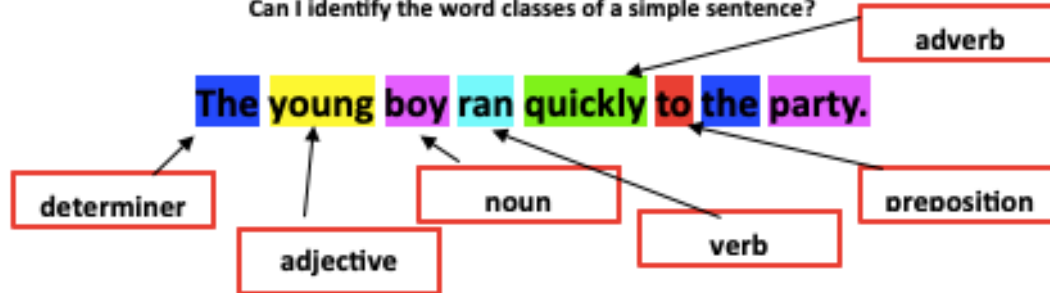




Can I identify the word classes of a simple sentence?



- apostrophe** shows missing letters and possession
- commas** used in lists, to join clauses, and separate extra information
- exclamation marks** shows exclamations, commands, or strong emotions
- inverted commas** shows direct speech

LESS

Less is used when talking about things that are *uncountable* or *have no plural*. It is compatible with collective nouns, non-countable nouns and volumes.

FEWER

Fewer is used when talking about things or people in the plural. It is used countable nouns and individual items.

Technical/Specific Nouns

A technical noun is a noun that is specifically used in a certain topic area. We generally only use these nouns when we are talking about that specific topic.

Example: **Maths**

angles fraction algebra average

Example: **Science**

mammal habitat atom beaker
