

Golden Thread: Belonging



apostrophe	shows missing letters and possession

exclamation shows exclamations, commands, or strong emotions

Technical/Specific Nouns

A technical noun is a noun that is specifically used in a certain topic area. We generally only use these nouns when we are talking about that specific topic.

Example: Maths

angles fraction algebra average

Example: Science

mammal habitat atom beaker

LESS

Less is used when talking about things that are *uncountable* or *have no plural*. It is complatible with collective nouns, non-countable nouns and volumes.

FEWER

Fewer is used when talking about things or people in the plural. It is used countable nouns and individual items.
