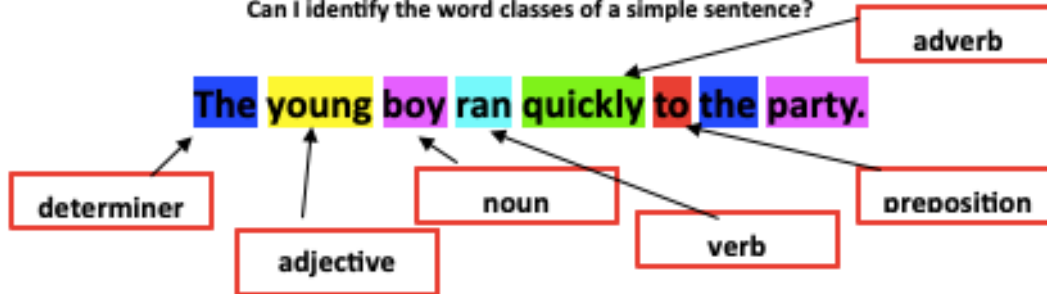




Can I identify the word classes of a simple sentence?



- '** **apostrophe** shows missing letters and possession
- ,** **commas** used in lists, to join clauses, and separate extra information
- !** **exclamation marks** shows exclamations, commands, or strong emotions
- “ ”** **inverted commas** shows direct speech

The Subject of a Sentence

The subject of a sentence is usually a noun. The actions of the subject are described by the verb in the sentence.



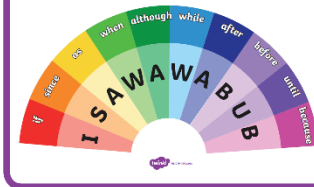
The **monster**
is **brushing** its teeth.



The **bear**
is **painting** a picture.

Subordinating Conjunctions

Here are 10 of the most common subordinating conjunctions. They are used at the beginning of a subordinating clause which is a clause that doesn't make sense on its own.



Co-ordinating Conjunctions

There are seven co-ordinating conjunctions. They give equal importance to the words or sentences they connect.



Technical/Specific Nouns

A technical noun is a noun that is specifically used in a certain topic area. We generally only use these nouns when we are talking about that specific topic.

Example: **Maths**
